J. I. MORRIS SCHOLARSHIP ANNOUNCEMENT

J.I. Morris was a Southbridge businessman who died at 97 in 1982. His career began in Philadelphia when he studied business at night school while he worked during the day. His initiative and search for challenge in business eventually brought him to Southbridge where he founded the J.I. Morris Company.

The J.I. Morris Scholarship Fund was created from memorial gifts given at the time of his death by friends and family members in the hope that other men and women given similar educational and business opportunities will be able to prosper in business.

The Rotary Club of Southbridge administrators the endowment and makes the awards at their discretion from the interest accumulated from the principal of the J.I. Morris Scholarship Fund. In order for us to consider you for an award, we ask that you complete a brief application. In it, tell us who you are, what your goal is and the amount of financial assistance you need from us to accomplish this objective.

The scholarship is available to both residents of Charlton and Southbridge. The grants may be used for such items as: tuition and books in a one or two-year post-secondary school educational experience, for tools or other education courses that would enable the applicant to improve his or her business skills, or in such other ways as seems consistent with this philosophy.
